ONE SCHOOL, MANY OPTIONS

In the Early Years section, students benefit from a dual language environment. In the Primary section, teachers alternate classes in English and in French. From Y7 to Y11 students may choose the French track or the English International Programme (EIP). In Y11 students make the final decision: Bac Français, BFI or IB Diploma.

Early Years Section (3 & 4 year olds) Two languages, simultaneously

When is the best time to start a second language? Our answer is, as soon as possible!

Young learners benefit from our unique Early Years dual language immersion programme from the age of 3. They are guided by two teachers who each communicate in their respective native language with the support of a Teaching Assistant.

This setting creates the ideal conditions for bilingualism to flourish naturally in a safe and nurturing environment. Within a short period of time, children effortlessly switch from one language to the other with their teachers while acquiring the culture and love of both languages.









Primary Section (Y1 to Y6) Two languages, alternately

Our school has developed a unique pedagogy whereby teachers, one English and one French, work in pairs. Our bilingual curriculum covers the compulsory components of both the French and the English programmes.

Our young learners cover the major academic subjects: humanities, literature, maths, and science. Lessons are delivered in one or the other language, organically creating strong foundations for bilingualism and multicultural exploration.

The bilingual curriculum creates links between topics and explores common themes among the subjects taught by the two teachers. This experience is enhanced by the use of differentiated teaching methods with a focus on developing critical thinking, collaboration and risk-taking.









Secondary Section (Y7 to Y13) Two programmes, one mission

The Bac Français Bilingue is taught mostly in French with enhanced English, and leads to the French national exams: Brevet, Bac Français and BFI.

The English International Programme (EIP) is taught mostly in English, with French as the second language (beginner or advanced), and leads to six IGCSEs and the IB Diploma in Y12 and Y13. No previous knowledge of French is required in this track.

From Y7 to Y10 our students continue to broaden and train their minds to think in two languages. From literature to the arts, from science to maths, they acquire fluency not only in the use of two languages but also in the understanding of different approaches to problem-solving and the influence of different cultures on the way we think. We initiate the formal study of a third modern language in Y7. Students can choose between Mandarin, Spanish and German.

OUR SIGNATURE CLASSES FOSTER CURIOSITY

PROMOTING OUR STUDENTS' WELLBEING



Our Head of Pastoral Care & Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) runs a nuturing department whose aim is to support all students. Our bilingual and bicultural counsellors fully understand the challenges of multiculturalism. Our visiting "Dogtor George" (therapy trained dog) is a patient listener and offers a unique opportunity for non-verbal support. In addition, we have a Safeguarding Squad made up of twelve members of staff and one Governor.
